A \$75,000 grant from The Sutphin Family Foundation will provide Alzheimer's and dementia care certification for nursing staff throughout The Christ Hospital Health Network as well as a patient "memory room" at the hospital's Health & Aging Center in Oakley.

Certification will help nurses identify sooner, enabling physicians and families to better prepare for, and respond to, patients' needs. The "memory room" will provide a familiar, comfortable space for patients, with mid-century-style décor, reading materials, music, and lowstimulating activities that caregivers can implement at home to help prevent agitation, wandering, memory decline, and additional health problems.

"The Sutphin Family's support will help us better meet the needs of this vulnerable group confronted with the challenges of Alzheimer's disease and dementia. Their generosity will improve the quality of our patients and families lives during very difficult times," says Dr. Stephen Mueller, Chief of Geriatrics at The Christ Hospital Health Network.

Off the Wall Benefits Safe Sleep and Breastfeeding

The Christ Hospital Foundation Guild's Off the Wall event raised \$20,000 to benefit the hospital's Safe Sleep and Breastfeeding Support Program. The program aligns with city-wide efforts to reduce infant mortality in Cincinnati, which is among the highest in the country. Proceeds have provided wearable blankets for babies called "sleep sacks," as well as safe sleep education and breastfeeding services for mothers.

"I am proud of how this event helped bring more attention to the infant mortality crisis in our city," says Robbie Russo, Guild Member and Co-Chair of Off the Wall. "We are very grateful to everyone who worked with us to

make it a fun and exciting evening, and to all who came out to show their support."

More than 100 works of art, donated by local artists, were displayed throughout the event venue. Guests participated in a lottery to take home art "off the wall" and had the opportunity to purchase select works through a silent auction and live auction. Artist Risa Sreden Prince, who manages special events at Essex Studios and is a member of the Kennedy Heights Art Center Collective, served as the Art Curator.
