

PGY1 Residency Program

PGY I residency programs build upon Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) education and outcomes to develop pharmacist practitioners with knowledge, skills, and abilities as defined in the educational competency areas, goals, and objectives. Residents who successfully complete PGY I residency programs will be skilled in diverse patient care, practice management, leadership, and education, and be prepared to provide patient care, seek board certification in pharmacotherapy (i.e., BCPS), and pursue advanced education and training opportunities including postgraduate year two (PGY2) residencies.

PGY I residents will be an integral part of the medication use process at The Christ Hospital. The residency will serve to help the resident develop a secure understanding of the clinical, distributive, and administrative aspects of hospital pharmacy. Through a variety of required and elective learning experiences, residents will gain confidence to effectively function as a member of a multi-disciplinary team. - Graduate of an ACPE-accredited College of Pharmacy with a Doctor of Pharmacy degree
- Eligible for pharmacist licensure in Ohio
- US citizen or legal resident
- Meets criteria for employment at The Christ Hospital, including a negative drug and tobacco screen

- Four references
- Supplementary application material described on residency website
